1. Marching Show:

2. Instructors:

- MONDAY, JULY 22nd: Full band (1-6:00pm), PARENT PREVIEW NIGHT


WHAT SHOULD I DO BEFORE CAMP?

- 1. Get your body moving! Engage in varying intensities of aerobic exercise walking around the neighborhood, riding a bike, jogging or running. It's important to get your body used to being outside and in the heat before it becomes an issue.
- 2. Eat balanced, nutritious meals and snacks. Drink plenty of water stay away from sugary drinks! The sugar can dehydrate you faster. Food equals fuel, so make sure you're picking options that will keep you fuller longer and avoid discomfort.

WHAT SHOULD I BRING?

- 1. A LARGE water jug to keep with you during the day
- 2. Comfortable, light athletic clothes. Please do not wear jeans or heavy materials!
- 3. For wind players and drumline a lyre (clip) specific to your instrument and flip folder with extra protective sheets, purchasable from Music and Arts. Please let me know if you have any questions on what to purchase. I have a limited number of extra flip folders available for those in need.
