- What is the setting of the story and does it remind you of a place you have been?

There is a lot of great fiction for readers to enjoy. But reading for information will become more and more important as your child progresses in school. To help your child get facts share news articles about his/her interest. Browse the internet for more information on a subject of his/her choice. Add nonfiction to the reading list when choosing a book.
