1. Call to Order

- A. Chad Huffines called the meeting to order at 6:33 pm.

3. Academics

- A. Principals Reports (see attached)
 - Ms. Spencer recognized Lily Oliver, owner of Balloon Bar and Taylor LeVan for creating a back-to-school photo area. Thanks also to Ms. Jones, as she begins leadership of the Parent Volunteer Committee, which will provide support for staff and parent involvement opportunities.
 - 2. Ms. Whitfield provided an overview of testing, assessments and data.
 - 3. Ms. Gladden shared IXL, an online learning tool CGS acquired last week. This platform supports reading, math, science and Spanish teachers.
 - 4. Dr. Morris reported that CGS now has 6 fall sports teams. Their Senior Night will be October 3. BoosterThon fundraiser was a success for K-8 students! Please review the calendar events attached or online.
 - 5. Mr. Kane informed the Board that grades 6-12 participated in Protecting Our Students, which focuses on recognizing and reporting inappropriate behavior and sexual misconduct. Nurse Corbett provided training for responding to medical events, such as diabetic shock, seizures, allergies ...
 - B. NC School Report Card was reviewed by Ms. Vereyken. CGS maintained its C rating, with Grade Level Proficiency score of 56.4, higher than ABSS average. https://ncreports.ondemand.sas.com/src/?county=Alamance

- A. Safety Plan: Lt. Hall has been working with CGS to set up a reunification plan, and a Crisis Safety Team at each campus. The Safety Grant allowed for vaping sensors in bathrooms, additional cameras and system replacement at K-8 campus, and safety training.
- B. Charter Renewal Updates:
